STONINGTON, CT- Oct. 4, 2022 – We are excited to announce the Fifth Annual Mystic Film Festival, returning to four local venues with new feature films, short films, events, and workshops from October 20th to the 23rd. This year's festival will bring 93 new short and feature-length documentary and narrative films from around the world. student films, a screenwriting competition, filmmakers' workshops, panel discussions, and a celebratory tribute to honor actress, comedian, and singer, Ruth Buzzi. This year's Mystic Film Festival is set to be an essential event for local patrons of the arts and for filmmakers from around the world.

<u>Tickets are available online</u>. The festival's 2022 slate of films covers a range of topics that the unique medium of motion pictures encompasses so well. From the existential to the personal, the international to the local, we are thrilled to present a diverse array of films and themes from around the globe. Hosting the screenings, panels, and workshops locally will be Mystic Luxury Cinemas, La Grua Center; United Theatre of Westerly, Rhode Island, and Mystic Seaport Museum's Thompson Building. The festival will also present a selection of this year's films for <u>encore online screenings</u> from Oct. 24-30.

FESTIVAL OPENING NIGHT FILM

The festival opens Thursday, **Oct. 20, at 6:00 pm** at the Mystic Luxury Cinema with a screening of the feature *Amerikatsi*, which recently won Best Narrative Feature at the Woodstock Film Festival is Woodstock, New York. *Amerikatsi* is a story of an Armenian-American who repatriates to Armenia, only to be sent to a Soviet prison. Hopeless and alone, he discovers he can see into a nearby apartment from his cell window, where a native Armenian man, unaware that he is being watched, slowly reveals the soul of Armenia hidden behind the iron curtain. Join us at 6:00 pm for a wine reception, and 6:30 pm - 9:00 pm for a screening and Q&A with writer, director, and lead actor Michael Goorjian.

HONOR and CELEBRATE

2022 Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient - Ruth Buzzi

To honor the lifetime, professional achievements of an actress whose comedy career has spanned nearly 60 years of timeless film and television: Ruth Buzzi. The festival is honored to award her with its Lifetime Achievement Award. Born in Westerly, Rhode Island and raised in Stonington, Connecticut, Buzzi is known for her comedy show *Rowan and Martin's Laugh- In*, which won her a Golden Globe award and numerous Emmy nominations. Buzzi also appeared on *Sesame Street, Saved By the Bell*, and *Freaky Friday*. In her honor, on Oct. 22 at 7:00 pm at La Grua Center in Stonington, the festival will celebrate women filmmakers and their short films *Perfect Match*, *Amber*, *Scotch*, *Please*, and *Shhh!*. Actor and comedian Emily Siero will open the event, and a wine and cheese social with the filmmakers will follow. The event is co-sponsored by Women In Film and Video of New England and will be hosted by its president, Sharon Contillo.

WORLD PREMIERE of RESTORED 1920's FILM

On Saturday, Oct. 22, at 5:30 p.m. La Grua Center hosts a world premiere of the 1920 restored film *The Church with the Overshot Wheel*. The narrative short features a grain miller who lost his daughter and converted his mill -which is the Old Town Mill in New London - into a church This film is one of the two surviving

'O Henry Features' of the 94 produced in the early 1900's by The Vitagraph Co of America and Doubleday. Following the film, there is a Q&A with Suzanne Harle who plans to discuss her finding of the film and the restoration process with the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. Prior to the screening of this film is a wonderful documentary about the importance of film restoration, called *Film, The Living Record Of Our Memory*, at La Grua Center on October 22nd at 3 pm.

MYSTIC FILM FESTIVAL WELCOMES VETERAN ACTORS KAREN ALLEN and WILLIAM SADLER

On Sunday, Oct. 23, 3 pm, the festival will close with the narrative feature, *A Stage of Twilight* at Mystic Luxury Cinemas. The film follows a retired couple, Cora and Barry, who are enjoying life in their seventies. After Barry is rushed to the hospital due to having a severe coughing attack, he is later diagnosed with a fatal heart disease. Therefore, Barry rents a trailer home in the middle of the woods where he can die alone in peace. His hope for a dignified death proves to be a struggle for Cora, especially when Joey, a 17- year-old neighbor who acts as a surrogate son to the childless couple, enters the picture. As Barry's end approaches, Cora is driven to make a critical decision for them both.

Written & Directed by Sarah T. Schwab (*Life After You*), the film features Karen Allen (*Raiders of the Lost Ark*, *Animal House*) and William Sadler (*The Shawshank Redemption, The Mist*), two industry veterans whose dozens of roles have landed them in some of Hollywood's most iconic films. A moderated conversation with Schwab, Allen, and Sadler will follow the screening.

On Friday, Oct. 21, at 3 pm the La Grua Center will host a special screening of the documentary film *The Oystering Life*, directed and produced by Steve Hamm,

including a Q&A with the director. Join us and enjoy a glass of prosecco and taste some locally purveyed oysters.

FILMMAKERS' RECEPTION and WORKSHOPS

The festival also will host a reception for this season's filmmakers and others in the movie industry on Friday, Oct. 21, at 6:30 pm at La Grua Center in Stonington. In addition, La Grua will screen students' films on Saturday and Sunday.

All workshops and panel discussions will be conducted at the Mystic Seaport Museum:

- Friday, Oct. 21, 12:30 pm Women in Film and Video of New England board member and composer, Grace-Mary Burega, will give a step-by step guide to working with a composer as a director, producer, writer, or filmmaker. Topics include why you would need a composer for your project, the advantages of custom music over library or royalty-free music, how to pick a composer, how to communicate your vision, temp scores, how to spot a film, and how to give revision notes.

 Andrew Gernhard, and Head of Production at <u>The Locations</u> Kate

- successful careers as screenwriters, showrunners and executive producers in Hollywood. Jason Filardi made his debut in Hollywood with the box office hit *Bringing Down The House*, which starred Steve Martin and Queen Latifah. That film went on to become one of the highest grossing comedies of 2003, grossing over 130 million in the United States alone. Peter Filardi is best known as the screenwriter behind *Flatliners*; *The Craft*; *Ricky 6*; TNT's *Salem's Lot*; an episode for *Nightmares and Dreamscapes*. Most recently, Filardi has worked as writer and showrunner of the Epix limited series *Chapelwaite* starring Adrien Brody and Emily Hampshire.
- Sunday, Oct. 23, 10:30 am, join us for a panel discussion with director and cinematographer Indy Saini, director Lynda Reiss, producer Steven Robert Kozlowski, director and writer Sashia Dumont, and director and cinematographer Paul Robinson, to discuss how directors and cinematographers work in unison to bring their vision to life on the screen. All of the above individuals also have films screening at this year's festival; Women In The Front Seat, Perfect Match, Two Eyes, and Amber.
- Sunday, Oct. 23, 12:30 pm Meet Jason Connell, an award-winning documentary producer and director, founder of The United Film Festival, and most recently a popular podcast producer and host, as he shares his amazing journey from award-winning documentarian to podcaster. In 2019, Connell chased another passion and launched <u>Just Curious Media</u>, which creates highly entertaining and immersive podcasts including *Let's Talk Cobra Kai*, a humorously nostalgic podcast covering all things in The Karate Kid and Cobra Kai universe. Due to good timing, and good luck, this show has become the #1 podcast covering Cobra Kai, the hit

series on Netflix.

AWARDS CEREMONY

The Mystic Film Festival's final day of screenings wraps up with an awards ceremony Sunday, Oct. 23, at 6:30 pm at La Grua Center. The

festival awards include best narrative feature, feature documentary, narrative short, documentary short, New England film, cinematography, directing, screenplay writing, student film, human rights, and conservation. Also at the ceremony, the top five screenplay winners will be announced. The grand-prize winner will receive a ISA *Connect* membership and a consultation with a literary manager.
